Over the past fortnight the Rockets have been continuing to explore their class novel, 'Tin Forest', using emotive language to write a diary from the point of view of the main character. In maths, we have been thinking about ratio and applying this to real-life scenarios. The Rockets and Ladybirds worked extremely hard to prepare for their Christmas Play which resulted in two fantastic performances - well done everyone, you should be very proud of yourselves!

The last two weeks have flown by in Ladybirds and we have continued to enjoy our English work on The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch and even found the time to make some sandwiches to help us write instructions. We are sure Mr Grinling (and those cheeky seagulls!) would have enjoyed eating them. In maths, the numbers continue to grow larger by the minute and we are becoming experts in using different strategies to add subtract. Finally, we do hope that those of you who came along to watch 'Straw and Order' enjoyed watching it as much as the children loved performing it. I'm sure you will agree, they were all amazing!

St Andrew's

What an adventure we have had! Home learning and a temporary relocation to All Saints, it has really been quite an eventful two weeks for the children and staff at St Andrew's. The children have been amazing and we were thrilled with their home learning and how well they settled at All Saints. They have enjoyed a brilliant afternoon of PE with the All Saints children and have been developing their social skills on the playground.

In Comelites the children have been exploring diary entries and have been considering their use of vocabulary and how to convey the thoughts and feelings of the writer. In maths we are continuing our understanding of multiplication and division. We are continuing to use a variety of methods including our use of times tables, concrete resources and written methods. In history we have been thinking about settlements and the reasons for choosing certain locations for a settlement. We have also used our historical learning to name and locate places on a map.

In Butterflies we have been learning all about The Lighthouse Keepers Picnic. We made sandwiches and then wrote instructions for Mr Grinling, so he knows what to do if Mrs Grinling is out. We thought carefully about imperative verbs and time conjunctions. In maths we have been learning more methods for subtraction and addition, such as using the number bonds to twenty in year one and the column method in year three. We have been enjoying learning to sing new songs, dances and our lines for the Christmas play. We have also learnt about advent and made a class advent calendar together.

All Saints

In Asteroids, we have been writing persuasive letters to the Prime Minister about the issue of plastic pollution. We have had to think about our use of formal language as well as using facts and figures to back up our arguments. We also wrote diary entries from the perspective of the old man in The Tin Forest. In Maths, we have been increasing our confidence with formal multiplication methods. We have looked at prime, square and cube numbers, and we can confidently name all the prime numbers up to 100! We will be using our mathematical thinking in science by creating graphs and charts based on investigations. In RE, we have finished exploring our key question on how religion has impacted the arts. We have really reflected upon our learning and had some really in-depth debates.

In Dragonflies, we have been learning all about Mr Grinling and the story of The Lighthouse Keepers Picnic. We got to make sandwiches with a whole range of different fillings which were really tasty. We discussed how we made our sandwiches and used this to write instructions using imperative verbs and different conjunctions for Mr Grinling so he can make his own. In Maths, we have been looking at addition and subtraction and the different ways which we can solve problems. This included looking at our number bonds beyond 10 as well as using the column method in Year 3. Over the past few weeks, we have rehearsed and performed our Nativity, Straw and Order. The children were amazing, and it was lovely to see so many of you there!

Online Safety

Omegle is a website which is designed to allow users to talk to strangers. It works by randomly matching users to talk one-to-one using either text or video. It is free to use and with no requirement for age verification, anyone can sign up and start chatting. Recently, many concerns, such as the dangers around talking to strangers and the prevalence of adult content, have been raised about the safety and use of Omegle.

The best way to support your child with life online is maintaining an open and honest dialogue about their online interests, including favourite apps and games. By showing you're interested, children are also more likely to feel comfortable coming to you if there's an issue. Omegle is a website that pairs random strangers for live text or video chats. It first launched in 2009 and its slogan is "Talk to strangers!" There is an option for adult (18+) content and a section for people aged 13+ with parental permission. Anyone can use the site. Users simply go to Omegle.com and then choose 'Text' or 'Video' chat and the page states how many users are currently online. Depending on the time of day this can be hundreds of thousands. Omegle markets itself as a great way to meet new friends however has been known to feature pornography and inappropriate content within chats, so it's important parents are aware of the risks associated with the site.


